

CIRRICULUM VITAE



Prof. Dr.-Ing. Ataman Haksever (1939) was full professor in the field of reinforced concrete structures as well as structural analysis at Trakya University, Çorlu Faculty of Engineering before the emeritus. He is graduated from Istanbul Technical University in 1962. Since 1965 he worked as structural engineer, for several years, in some construction companies (Strabag Bau-AG.) and engineering bureaus in Hamburg, Germany. During this period he completed the structural analysis of some metro tunnels (Wandsbeker Chaussee, Hamburg), tall buildings (Wikinger Turm, Schleswig) beside some super structures. After this practical experience he returned to research at the Braunschweig Technical University in 1973.

He holds the Dr.-Ing. (Braunschweig Technical University, 1977) and Habilitation (Braunschweig Technical University and Istanbul Technical University, 1982) degrees in the field of "Analysis of Concrete Structures under Fire Attack". He wrote some scientific expertise reports for the prediction of fire effects on some structures in Germany and abroad as well (Wiener Reichsbrücke in Vienna, Subways in Hamburg and Oymapınar).

He is the author of many papers (~100), published in western countries and overseas (Germany, USA, Sweden) on various aspects on the field of structural engineering, especially on the behaviour of structural bearing elements in fire as well as on research work carried out for heat balance investigations in Germany and Finland. He made research to investigate the development of natural fires in enclosures, both theoretically and experimentally. (Braunschweig Technical University, Sonderforschungsbereich 148, Germany, Lund University, Sweden and at the Helsinki University of Technology, Finland).

After he returned back to Turkey, he held lectures since 1988 in Firat University, at the Faculty of Civ. Engineering, on structural analysis and concrete design. Prof. Haksever joined Corlu Faculty of engineering in 2002. He has been Dean for the same Faculty in 2004.

He speaks English, German and French beside his native language Turkish.

He is emeritus since 2006.
